Substance Use Conversation Starters

- Find time to talk to your child early and often about substance use, rather than a one-and-done conversation.
- Short conversations are fine. If your child is uncomfortable, you can try another time.
- Try to bring up topics naturally, based on people you see in real life or in movies that you watch together.
- Use a neutral tone when you share your views about substance use, rather than being judgmental.
- Avoid language that would shut down a dialogue about substance use.
